The picture: I think this was the last time the Post Board meeting was held on Saturday morning (I think it was still morning)

The President, Carolyn Combs, had brought the gavel down on the Convention. It was announced that the Incoming Officers would be sworn in as soon as they could change into their white “dresses” and the Post Board would start as soon as the Installation was finished. We settled into our places at the table, accomplished the business of the Post Board meeting with Ruth Eblen the new National President. When finished with the business, she rapped the gavel and declared the

Post Board Meeting adjourned and we “the new Officers” went on with the day.

We changed once again into the more formal dress for the picture session and then went to the “formal” installation along with the FRA incoming Officers that evening. This took place in 1994 and it was in Virginia Beach VA. (MY year as RPWC) I am the person in the white hat, the 7th person, in the row nearest the camera. It looks like I have my right hand on my hat but it is just beside my head. That is when I retired the white hat and took on the Gray hat for the next 4 years.

As for the white hat: Most of the white hats that members wore – even the National Officers – they were purchased from Navy Stores and were what the WAVES wore. The WAVES in those days had to join the Ladies Auxiliary of the Fleet Reserve Assn. as the FRA was only for male service men! So their hats were the Auxiliary uniform. I still have mine though it is retired.

Customs and Traditions – How do they Begin?

Have you ever questioned how the clapping of hands when a person is being escorted to the front of any meeting got started? I was told that it had always been used. Yet when I joined in 1958 this was not being used. SOOOOO here is the answer. This was printed in a **Frame**, from Branches 47, 62, 70, 80, and 313 in the Southwest Region, and written by Bob Nolan, NED Emeritus FRA. This in answer to a question put to him in FL at the National Convention by one of the Shipmates.

Quote

"It is a custom that came into being less than 30 years ago. It evolved from the FRA and LA FRA national officer elect joint installation ceremony. The two groups did not always install at a joint installation, as they do now.

The FRA/LA FRA joint installation ceremony began with Past National President William A Holdforth's national convention in Memphis, TN in 1973. (The LA FRA NP was Adaline E McDonough). The practice of the audience applauding in cadence was originally a part of the Ladies' installation ritual".

FRA'S FIRST FORMAL INSTALLATION

The first formal installation of the FRA national officers-elect was conducted at the convention banquet of National President Robert L Bastian, in Detroit MI at the 1971 Convention. In prior years, the installation of newly-elected officers was conducted on the convention floor after the national elections and just before the "Good of the Order" session. In those years the LA FRA conducted their installation in a separate ceremony.

As you may expect, the Ladies' ceremony had more "pomp and circumstance" than the FRA's installation. An integral part of the Auxiliary's ceremony was to parade their National President around the room, to the accompaniment of piano music before presenting her before the altar to take her oath of office. During the "parade", the audience clapped in rhythmic cadence to the piano music. It was an impressive ritual.

A FORMAL JOINT INSTALLATION

It took almost fifty years to convince the FRA's leadership to adopt a formal installation ceremony. However, once they adopted the idea, it was not long before the Ladies petitioned the FRA's leadership to merge the two separate formal ceremonies into one. Experience taught us early that the joint installation ceremony should not be lengthy. Consequently, for the sake of time, in merging the two ceremonies, some compromises had to be made. The Ladies' time-consuming "parading ritual" and the piano music was shortened, but the Ladies' practice of clapping in cadence was retained. Naturally, in time, the audience also began to clap as the FRA officers-elect were presented at the altar. Consistent practice makes for tradition and the "clapping in Cadence" soon became a FRA custom.

with the FRA slowly shedding its chauvinistic image, the joint installation ceremony began to rival the FRA/LAFRA joint opening ceremonies and the convention banquet as the social highlight of the conventions. The uniform of the day for participating male officers became formal dress. Soon, Shipmates of the audience began to attend in formal dress! In due time, the Shipmates began to wear their miniature military medals with the formal dress. Everyone was so resplendent in their formal dress and pleased with the new-found dignity of the formal installation that no one seemed to notice that a custom of the Ladies Auxiliary had crept to the FRA national officers' ceremony.

WELCOMING GUESTS SPEAKERS

The FRA and its Auxiliary now hold three joint activities during their annual national conventions: the joint opening ceremonies, the joint installation and the convention banquet. The "clapping in cadence" to recognize officers-elect at the installation is step away from recognizing and welcoming an FRA Distinguished guest speaker by the same unique action. Slowly, but surely, the audience's clapping in cadence, (as the convention Master-at-Arms escorts the guest from the rear of the convention hall to the podium) has become the FRA's custom of saying "Welcome" to convention guest speakers.

NEWS FROM THE UNITS

LET US KNOW WHAT YOUR UNIT IS DOING

Unit 161 MO-KAN, along with the Shipmates. is working with the Veteran's Community Project in Kansas City MO. They are building a "Tiny Home Community" (Veterans Village). The Unit members are putting together Welcome Home Kits to be given to the VCP, for them to help furnish the Tiny Homes. The homes are 240 sq. feet and have a kitchen, bathroom, and bed, desk, table and chairs, flat screen TV, a fully stocked refrigerator and all the items they need to live, dishes, linens etc... The Unit is supplying a lot of those items. They expect to start moving them in by August of this year.

Unit 93 Tom Vallee works diligently with the local Veteran's home. They have completely re-organized the library there, they teach music lessons, entertain the Veterans, put together a movie library for the Veterans, and sometimes just spend time with the Veterans. Some weeks they are there almost daily!

I am sure the Units, nationwide, have many stories to share and we would love to share them with the rest of the Auxiliary.
