#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

May's subject is report forms. I know, I know, how many times must we go over this subject? Well, I guess until everyone gets it, right! By the way, all report forms are on the la-fra.org web-site and fillable this year. Your Unit number, Unit Name, Region, Date submitted, total number of members go at the top of the Report (you get points for this), also your group number. Please fill in everything that the Unit has done in the appropriate places. When filling out the form, please print or type (type preferred), neatness counts for points. There are several people on the committees that must judge these reports and we would like to save time by being able to read the report without having to guess what certain words are. It tells you at the bottom of the page, the people that these reports need to be sent to. These people should all be in the National Appointments Roster sent to your secretary by the NES Doris Fri PNP. You will also put at the bottom of the report, your group # and number of votes. You will automatically receive this information from the NFS Pat Suckow by June. Group numbers are valid till March 31 and after that they are edited for next year. Your grouping will be sent to your Secretary by June 15<sup>th</sup> and this group # is required on your report twice.

It also has space for the Region you are in (you may abbreviate your Region on the bottom). Now having done all that, your President and Secretary must sign the forms (you also get points for signatures). **All** Reports stay in the Region you are in except for the Unit Report. When the Unit Reports are judged, the first- place winners are the only ones to go to National and will be presented by the Regional President to the NES who will pass them to the Convention Unit Report Committee. All reports are due by July 15 of the current year. The reason for getting them in as soon as possible, is to get them all distributed to the proper persons for judging. You cannot bring reports to a meeting and expect all the people who must judge to be able to do that in a timely manner. This is one of the reason's that it takes so long for the committees to get done with the judging.

We just need a little cooperation on this matter, so all the conventions will run more smoothly.

Please refer to C&BL Section 1406

Section 1406. Election of Unit Officers Option Section 1406(a). Any Unit may petition for an exception to Section 1405. Section 1406(b). Any Unit may petition the Regional President for permission to elect a President and four (4) Directors for the subsequent Unit Administrative years. Section 1406(c). The Regional President shall report those petitions approved to the delegates at the next Regional Convention for ratification. A majority vote is required for ratification. Section 1406(d). Upon written approval from the Regional President to operate under the provisions of Section 1406 and after elections but prior to installation, the unit President shall appoint one of the Directors to perform the duties of the Secretary as outlined in other sections of Article 14, Section 1407. # <u>DRAPING OF THE UNIT CHARTER</u> Chapter 20 – Unit Instructions and Rituals



(Note: The Unit Charter is draped for thirty days upon the death of a member and when notified by the National or Regional President to do so upon the death of a National or Past National Officer.)

# **SYMBOLIC TRIANGLE**

#### Section 1015, page 19, Unit Instructions and Ritual

"The Symbolic Triangle is the symbol of the Ladies Auxiliary of the Fleet Reserve Association. From the United States Flag to the Unit Banner signifies Loyalty; the Unit Banner to the Altar represents Service; and from the Altar to the United States Flag represents Protection. The area within the Symbolic Triangle is reserved for the performance of Ritual ceremonies. The Triangle is the emblem used officially, when appropriate, which indicates the three Sea Services the United States Navy, Marine Corps and Coast Guard."

#### WHAT IS A QUORUM?

According to **Robert's Rules**, a **quorum** is the minimum number of voting members who must be present at a properly called meeting to conduct business in the name of the group. A **quorum** should consist of "as large as can be depended upon for being present at all meetings when the weather is not exceptionally bad."

**C&BL**, **Section 1414** (page 67) Quorum - Each Unit defines its own quorum. A quorum may be declared at the completion of the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting.

# Facts from the LA FRA History Book (History Books may be purchased from NFS)

The year was 1930: On Friday evening on the seventh day of March, Brooklyn Branch 2, of the Fleet Reserve Association held their regular meeting. The Wives, mothers, sisters and daughters, of their members had been invited to be present for, the purpose of, forming a Ladies Auxiliary to their Branch. A large group of ladies attended. An impromptu meeting of the women followed and pro-tem officers were elected.

President, Eleanor Kuehn, Vice President Ann Herrity, Secretary/Treasurer Catherine Wertman, and five members of the Executive Committee: Alvida Koch, Mae Nocilla, Mary Matheson, Florence Moran, and Theresa Harvey.

Brooklyn Unit 2 had it's first meeting on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of March 1930, and the pro-tem officers were duly elected to permanent status. Many hours of work and deliberation went into the writing of the the Constitution and By-Laws for the Auxiliary. A preamble to the Constitution was written and presented to the ladies by Shipmate Martin Herrity of Brooklyn.

"Having a keen sense of responsibility, being true Americans citizen and bearing in mind the preamble of the Constitution of the Fleet Reserve Association: we, the wives, mothers, sisters, and daughters of members of the Fleet Reserve Association, do band ourselves together to aid, assist, and promote in all matters pertaining to the welfare, social and patriotic work for the benefit of the Fleet Reserve Association, its members and their families. Thus, do we associate and declare these principles to be the foundation and the Constitution of the Fleet Reserve Auxiliary"

Sensing the need of extending the Auxiliary organization to include all Branches of the Association, and a charter for such an organization would be necessary, the Auxiliary officers met with the Branch Board of Directors and plans were formulated to for presentation of a resolution to the Association's National Convention, to be held in the Wardman-Park Hotel in Washington DC, over the 1930 Labor Day weekend. This resolution asked permission for the women to organize NATIONALLY, and to request the granting of a charter to their organization. The completed resolution was duly presented in regulation form for action at the 1930 Convention.

The Brooklyn women were not idle. At their July meeting they selected their Secretary/Treasurer Catherine A. Wertman, as their spokesman to gain admission into and address the Association's convention to plead the cause of the Auxiliary. This was a gigantic assignment, for never in the six years since they had organized, had a member of the opposite sex been admitted into the "sacred portals" of the Fleet Reserve Association's Convention sessions. A group of the Brooklyn women met with Secretary Wertman in Washington, and at the opportune moment, were admitted into the convention hall. Mrs. Wertman was escorted to the platform and introduced by Shipmate National President Ruggles of San Diego, the presiding officer. Putting aside her prepared speech, Secretary Wertman spoke extemporaneously, stating her reasons for addressing the convention, pleading the cause of the Auxiliary, telling the delegates how much they needed the Auxiliary and the aid and sympathy of their womenfolk, organized to further their own organization's progress and that an Auxiliary properly formed and conducted would prove a great asset, and never a liability.
