National President's Project

My National President's Project for 2023 – 2024 is the Gary Sinise Foundation Program – H.O.P.E. - Their mission is to serve the nation by honoring its defenders, veterans, first responders, their families & those in need.

At the Gary Sinise Foundation, they serve our nation's defenders, to include our most severely wounded heroes, veterans of every conflict, first responders who run into danger within our communities, active-duty service members, their families, and the families of our fallen heroes. They do this by supporting them in their darkest times of need. Their unique programs are designed to help, entertain, educate, inspire, strengthen, and build communities across the nation.

Charity Navigator has awarded the Gary Sinise Foundation four out of a possible four stars, indicating that the Gary Sinise Foundation adheres to good governance and other best practices that minimize the chance of unethical activities and consistently executes its mission in a fiscally responsible way.

Their Relief & Resiliency Program includes a sub-program called H.O.P.E. this represents: Heal, Overcome, Persevere & Excel. This initiative provides support to those who have experienced trauma, illness, injury, or loss during their times of tragedy, sometimes with assistance as simple as help paying bills or buying groceries.

Our defenders and first responders are aware of the risks in their professions, but nothing can prepare them or their families for the pain of separation, trauma, and loss. When our heroes or their loved ones experience dark times, they seek to provide support and hope. Lending a hand can change the course of a life. Community - Bringing people together who have shared a common life trauma helps form a network of support. Sharing their experiences and reminding one another they are not alone; these groups can find joy in the present once again.

A note from National President Vera

This month we remember not a time of peace, but a time of war. A time of surprise. A time of tragedy. A time when lives changed in a blink of the eye. And when nations changed forever. A day that sparked the direct involvement of the United States in World War II. Sunday, December 7, 1941, was a pivotal point in history. It was a day that young men were sitting in their home listening to football games, as so many of us do today, a day that a country up to the time was at peace.

The attack came as a surprise to the American Navy, Maine Corps, Coast Guard, and Army and lead to great loss of life and equipment. Many American service men lost their lives or were injured, more than 2000 American citizens were killed and more than 1000 were injured. On the same day attacks were also launched against Malaya, Hong Kong, Guam, the Philippine Islands, Wake Island, and on December 8th an attack was launched against Midway Island.

The day after the attack, the United States declared war on Japan and so entered World War II. That day, those same young men that had been listening to football games yesterday, were heading out of their homes to recruiting stations. Families that had been making plans for Christmas and looking forward to the holidays that were coming up, were suddenly watching their husbands, their young sons, their brothers heading off, to a time of war.

In memory of those who lost their lives on Sunday, December 7, 1941, as well as the survivors.

We should guard in our hearts the sacred memory of those who gave their lives on the day which will live in infamy. To remember our military men and the Army Nurse Corps and Navy Nurse Corps who served our country so valiantly. Always remember Pearl Harbor, may we never forget the sons, fathers, friends, the. and the citizens of our land who were killed or wounded on December 7, 1941. Their sacrifices were not in vain. They defended America's freedom and demonstrated America's goodness.

We should give thanks for the brave men on that day as well as for every person that danger and conflict is part of their life and who made the ultimate sacrifice. We also should give thanks to those who fought and survived any attack on our country and went on with their lives in a way that portrayed honor to a watching world. They carried on with life even as they bore deep within them the haunting memories of what they witnessed, heard, and felt. As this group brave men and women become smaller in number, may they still be strong in the memories of their families for generations to come.

Just a little added note of interest – an excerpt from the LA FRA History Book, Auxiliary Year 1941-1943

National President Margaret Drobney, enroute to her home, made several official visits to Units and upon reaching San Diego, prepared to visit her husband on duty in Honolulu, She was accompanied by National Chaplain Rose Goesman after a visit the National Chaplain returned to the states and the National President elected to stay in Honolulu with her husband. Then came December 7th and the devastation of Pearl Harbor.

Those valiant women in the Honolulu Unit acted immediately, working under shell fire to give aid and comfort to the injured and dying, comforting the families, and trying to bring order out of chaos. The National President with the Unit members volunteered services for the war effort and regardless of their own heavy hearts carried on in Naval tradition. It was to be learned in due time that those of our people in the Islands of the Pacific who survived the Japanese invasions, were placed in concentration camps.

The people of the United States put every effort into the war. Our women volunteered their services for work with the American Red Cross; the Salvation army; the American Women's Volunteer Service; Air Raid Wardens; the United Service Organization and many other agencies.

Many of our women of the Ladies Auxiliary of the Fleet Reserve Association joined the WAVES, the SPARS and other service organizations.

Pages could have been written of the sacrifices made by all members throughout the organization, during this awful time of war, but who would dare to single out any one Unit or individual member for exploitation of their war effort? And because one cannot be chosen, let it be said here, "well done valiant women of the Ladies Auxiliary of the Fleet Reserve Association. You were never found wanting or reluctant to serve when your Country called for help."
