If you see something that needs to be adjusted, please write a resolution on it at your Unit and mail the original resolution with original signatures (not a picture or scanned copy) to the NES and send a copy to the National President, National Vice President, National Parliamentarian, and the Chairman of the C&BL Committee. Remember to follow the instructions in the C&BL Article 6, Section 608, subsections (a), (c), and (d), Section 1205 and the sub-sections or 1206 if a standing rule or ritual.

Auxiliary Members:

Have you thought about the people who help your Unit; however, they are ineligible to become members? Did you know that there is a way to honor their dedication to the auxiliary? Your Unit may send a resolution requesting that they be made honorary members of the auxiliary.

Each year at the National Convention these applications are reviewed by a committee concerning these wonderful people. Up to five Honorary members may be elected each year. Honorary members may serve on a committee of a Unit, or at a Regional or National Convention as a Chairman, Co-Chairman, or member.

According to our C & BL Article 3, Section 305(b), your nomination must be received no later than 120 days prior to the National Convention. What must be submitted is found in Article 3 Section 305(c) A certified statement, signed by the Unit President and Unit Secretary of the Unit submitting the resolution, stating in detail what distinguished service the nominee has rendered to the LA FRA and that the nominee is not otherwise eligible for membership in the LA FRA or FRA, shall accompany each nominating resolution for Honorary Membership.

Auxiliary Members, please look to your Unit and ask yourselves if you have someone who deserves this honor. When you find someone who fits the criteria, please submit the paperwork to request that they be considered for this honor.

From the Desk of the VAVS Chairman

Greetings Auxiliary Members:

We are doing so well with volunteering at VA Hospitals and Veteran Nursing Homes. Thank you for all you do. Here is some updated news and examples of work that gets us closer to reaching our goals.

The Virginia Department Veterans Services' Jones & Cabacoy Veterans Care Center_sits on a 26-acre piece of land, donated by the City of Virginia Beach and located near the Municipal Center. The 128-bed facility features all private rooms. Virginia Gov. Glenn Youngkin stated we need to serve our veterans, "which is to make sure they can get the help they need, when they need it, where they need it."

The new facility provides skilled nursing care, short-term rehabilitation, and Alzheimer's and dementia care for veteran residents, including physical and occupational therapy, speech and language pathology, nutrition, and bathing assistance. There are Veterans throughout Virginia Beach, Chesapeake, Norfolk, and Hampton Roads Area. The center's name honors the lives of two war heroes: Colonel William Jones III and Sergeant Christopher Cabacoy, both from the Hampton Roads area.

We will soon have a new federal Department of Veterans Affairs Chesapeake Health Care Center. Ground was broken last October for that 196,000-square-foot facility next to Chesapeake Regional Healthcare on Battlefield Boulevard.

This is a great opportunity for Auxiliary members to take part in volunteering at these two new facilities in Hampton roads. This is just one area of great news; we look forward to hearing from other Units with reports to share. An example shared from Unit 24: Hospital Committee Chair Kathy McCruden has some great news to share with our members.

First, Kathy delivered \$1,200 worth of in-kind clothing/supply donations to the Baltimore VA Medical Center, which were very much appreciated by the volunteer coordinators and sure to be enjoyed by the patients. These included clothing, linens, hygiene products, handmade items, and other miscellaneous supplies. Barbara Hrynyshen, Mattie Kovac and Hannah Sawyer were also instrumental in the collection, inventory, and delivery of these items. Kathy attended last week, presented by the Blue Star Families organization. Loretta Jorden recommended attending the seminar, which was suggested to us by Dorothy Smiley.

This was an hour-long presentation, jointly hosted by Kathy Roth-Douquet of the Blue Star Families organization, along with two members of the White House National Security Council, two members of the Pentagon Briefing Room, for the benefit of the Blue Star family members (families of the service members currently in active duty) and others who were permitted to join the remotely held event. Thanks to Kathy McCruden for all her great work.

At the Gary Sinise Foundation, they serve our nation's defenders, to include our most severely wounded heroes, veterans of every conflict, first responders who run into danger within our communities, active-duty service members, their families, and the families of our fallen heroes. They do this by supporting them in their darkest times of need. Their unique programs are designed to help, entertain, educate, inspire, strengthen, and build communities across the nation.

Charity Navigator has awarded the Gary Sinise Foundation four out of a possible four stars, indicating that the Gary Sinise Foundation adheres to good governance and other best practices that minimize the chance of unethical activities and consistently executes its mission in a fiscally responsible way.

Their Relief & Resiliency Program includes a sub-program called H.O.P.E. this represents: Heal, Overcome, Persevere & Excel. This initiative provides support to those who have experienced trauma, illness, injury, or loss during their times of tragedy, sometimes with assistance as simple as help paying bills or buying groceries.

Our defenders and first responders are aware of the risks in their professions, but nothing can prepare them or their families for the pain of separation, trauma, and loss.
