#### Greetings from the Sunny Southeast!

I have made official visits to four of our ten units, and they are very involved in their communities. Several of the units take food baskets to shut-in veterans and branch and unit members. Through their newsletter they ask for donations, and many of the members who are unable to attend the meetings send in donations to help with the various projects. Unit 269 in Goose Creek collects donations for their Toys for Tots drive (in partnership with the Marine Corps Reserve). Over the years they have collected money and then the members "go shopping" for the toys. Who doesn't like to go shopping with someone else's money! The number of toys they collect is unbelievable. They are also involved with several other projects. One of our unit members stops at businesses when they see a tattered flag and gently remind them that the flag needs to be replaced. They tell them they will pick up the tattered flag when it is replaced and take it to be disposed of properly. All of these activities promote our motto of "Loyalty, Protection and Service".

As with all of the Branches and Units, we are losing members to age, illness, and economics. It is important that the members work to keep the membership active. Maybe you could have a "birthday chairman" who makes sure to contact those members having a birthday that month. Phone calls, cards, emails are easy ways to keep in touch with the membership. Those members who are homebound or ill appreciate being remembered. If you don't have a newsletter, start one. This is a good way to keep in touch. Along with keeping all of your members, everyone needs to be recruiting new members.

The IRS doesn't like non-profits (because we don't pay taxes). They are looking closely at us to make sure we do what we are supposed to be doing. My National President's Project for 2024-2025 is "Paws for Purple Hearts". Their mission is to improve the lives of America's Warriors facing mobility challenges and trauma-related conditions such as PTSD and TBI by providing the highest quality Assistance Dogs and canine-assisted therapy programs; and by building public awareness about the Important role dogs play in helping Warriors along the road to recovery.

Paws for Purple Hearts is the world's only service dog organization for wounded Service Members and veterans that partners with Bergin College of Canine Studies. Bergin College is the first and only college in the world that focuses on training and learning about dogs. It was founded and continues to be led by the famous canine researcher and inventor of the service dog concept, Dr. Bonnie Bergin.

Through its unique mission to advance human-canine studies, it produces some of the best service dog trainers and highest quality assistance dogs. Although Paws for Purple Hearts Is now separate from Bergin College- all of their trainers are Bergin graduates.

As an employee at the VA Palo Alto Health Care/Veterans Affairs, I have had the opportunity to witness the facility dogs in action with veteran inpatients. It is quite a moving experience to see the works of these dogs and how they benefit our veterans. This non-profit 501(c)(3) organization is close to my heart.
