Dear Auxiliary Members:

Branch & Unit 197 cordially invite you to the 68th West Coast Region Convention on 12 & 13th of September 2025 at the Stanislaus Veterans Center, 3500 Coffee Road, Modesto, CA, 95354. More details are available on the Regional News: West Coast page of the LAFRA website.

Our West Coast members have been hard at work, diligently serving our veterans, active duty members and their families. Unit 274 has been preparing for the Annual Veterans baby shower, to be held May 31. Baskets are filled with all the supplies that a new mother may need and donated to Community Affairs at the VA in Reno, NV. Unit 59 recently co-hosted an open house to recruit new members, and they have been making jewelry for local craft shows. The money raised from the craft shows goes to charitable organizations. This past year we donated to the Gary Sinise Foundation, Hurricane Helene Relief Fund, St. Joseph's Food Pantry in memory of one of Wyoming Branch 59's shipmates and to the Friday Food Bag Foundation. This program provides Food Bags to children in our local school districts who may not eat well --or at all-- on the weekends.

The busy Unit 287 routinely participated in the quarterly "Last Call Ceremony", honoring the newly deceased veterans at the Palo Alto VA. They are particularly proud of their recent installation ceremony, which welcomed their new unit president, Patrice Blanchette. Recent donations have included: \$1,382 to the National President's Project "Paws for Purple Hearts" project from their cornhole tournament, Project Hope that supports CA fire victims, Shepherds Gate, a local women's shelter, and the Lupus foundation of America in recognition of Lupus Awareness month. Unit 137 provides baked goods to the local Marine Corp base monthly. Unit 8 routinely volunteers at the local Veterans hospital. Unit 261 conducts fund raisers and collects items to support their local Navy base and other local charities throughout the year. Unit 275, Hangtown hosted a successful mid-yr meeting and Unit 197 is hard at work preparing for our Regional Convention.

Lastly, I would like to revisit the fact that the organization continues to decline in numbers. I strenuously encourage each of you to consider embracing a Change Growth Mindset. We will never abandon our principles, but we must consider the adoption of more modern technology and pivot towards diversity and inclusivity to make the organization more compatible with the world we currently live in. National President's Project

My National President's Project for 2024-2025 is "Paws for Purple Hearts". Their mission is to improve the lives of America's Warriors facing mobility challenges and trauma-related conditions such as PTSD and TBI by providing the highest quality Assistance Dogs and canine-assisted therapy programs; and by building public awareness about the Important role dogs play in helping Warriors along the road to recovery.

Paws for Purple Hearts is the world's only service dog organization for wounded Service Members and veterans that partners with Bergin College of Canine Studies. Bergin College is the first and only college in the world that focuses on training and learning about dogs. It was founded and continues to be led by the famous canine researcher and inventor of the service dog concept, Dr. Bonnie Bergin.

Through its unique mission to advance human-canine studies, it produces some of the best service dog trainers and highest quality assistance dogs. Although Paws for Purple Hearts Is now separate from Bergin College- all of their trainers are Bergin graduates.

As an employee at the VA Palo Alto Health Care/Veterans Affairs, I have had the opportunity to witness the facility dogs in action with veteran inpatients. It is quite a moving experience to see the works of these dogs and how they benefit our veterans. This non-profit 501(c)(3) organization is close to my heart.
